

Together, these domains formed a comprehensive and interrelated framework that propelled CNU toward holistic, inclusive, and sustainable growth, a testament to its good governance.




SETTING POLICY DIRECTIONS


As part of the university's strengthening quality assurance and governance, CNU Board of Regents passed 388 resolutions.

Cebu Normal University reached a pivotal milestone with the approved 2024 Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 8688 entitled "An Act Converting the Cebu State College into a State University to be known as Cebu Normal University." This was the first in 122 years that CNU issued an IRR, which was approved by the CNU Board of Regents through Resolution No. 306, series of 2024. The IRR was published in the Official Gazette and in a newspaper of general circulation.

Moreover, the university, through the Finance Management Services Division (FMSD), achieved 63.33 percent (19 out of 30) compliance with audit recommendations, 28. 33% higher than the 35% requirement of sustained compliance with the audit recommendation for 2023 and prior per Administrative Order 25.

Aimed at optimizing the efficiency and effectiveness of FMSD's key operations, it adopted a day in and day out policy in processing of documents; deployed Human Resource Information System (HRIS) payroll module to the concerned delivery units; conducted capacity training to finance staff and responsibility center clerks; and improved support services to instruction research and extension services.

As the university fully embraced digitalization and automation, FMSD institutionalized the implementation of the eBudget system, which is an application system developed and designed to record and keep track of budget-related transactions, to be more agile, adaptive, and competitive in a landscape where speed and accuracy are crucial.

QUALITY ASSURANCE INITIATIVES

Cebu Normal University has maintained its International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 9001:2015 certification, demonstrating its commitment to quality, safety, and efficiency in management and customer service.

Its recertification was a testament of CNU's compliance with global standards for quality management following the establishment of its Quality Management System (QMS).

The QMS, which clearly defines processes and subprocesses in meeting the University policy as well as customer expectations and needs, was recertified on March 18, 2024 and is valid until January 24, 2027 by GCL International, Ltd., a leading certification body in the Philippines.



As of December 2024, all 33 or 100% of the undergraduate programs across the campuses were granted with Certification of Program Compliance (COPC) accreditation from the Commission on Higher Education (CHEd). The reason why CNU is among the top performing institutions in COPC compliance in Region VII.

Among the 48 graduate programs, 24 or 50% have received COPC accreditation, while 24 programs or 50% are awaiting feedback after undergoing the COPC evaluation and are currently addressing the compliance suggestions.


EXTERNAL AFFAIRS & LINKAGES

Cebu Normal University's External Affairs and Internationalization plays a pivotal role in propelling the institution forward by prioritizing forward-thinking strategies, and equips the academic community to navigate the complexities of the evolving global landscape with confidence and proficiency, ensuring CNU remains at the forefront of transformative education.

The institution implemented the I-SHINE strategy for 2024-2027, which aims to boost Internationalization at CNU by focusing on five key areas: (1) Strategic Partnerships, (2) Holistic Development, (3) Innovation in Education & Programs, (4) Network Expansion, and (5) Excellence in Research, SDGs and GCEd. These are anchored on the following foundations: CMO No. 55, s.2016, National Roadmap for Global Competitiveness in Communication Skills (NRGCCS), Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2028, Ambisyon Natin 2040, ASEAN Integration 2025, and the RA 11448 or the Transnational Higher Education Act.



In 2024, CNU further strengthened its global presence by connecting with 15 international partners, including universities, colleges, and agencies. Among these, nine are based in Asia, three in North America, two in Europe, and one in Australia.



CNU is incessantly exploring more partnership opportunities with Asian countries and in other countries that are open for academic mutual cooperation. University President Dr. Daniel Ariaso Sr.'s administration is committed and dedicated to promoting the internationalization of higher education as it envisioned CNU to become a premier institution for global engagement.

In 2024, CNU, represented by Dr. Ariaso, entered into a Memoranda of Understanding and Memoranda of Agreement with six new international partners.

The six new partners represented 40 percent out of 15 international partner institutions eyed for 2024.

By leveraging the provisions of the Transnational Higher Education Act, CNU is forging more robust collaborations with foreign institutions, especially in introducing joint degree programs, enhancing faculty exchange opportunities, and expanding research initiatives. As of the first semester of the 2024-2025 academic year, CNU welcomed six foreign students—1 Liberian, 1 Australian, 1 Kenyan, 2 Chinese, and 1 Korean.



Moreover, CNU has strengthened its partnerships and ties with local agencies, institutions and companies across the country. The University also inked a Memorandum of Agreement with 24 partners and a Memorandum of Understanding with three other partners.






INSTITUTIONAL RECOGNITIONS

The administration of CNU President Dr. Daniel Ariaso, Sr. vowed to ensure continual improvements in ratings. A testament to the administration's promise was CNU's placement in the 2024 edition of the World University Rankings for Innovation (WURI). From 98th place in 2023, CNU went up to 95th place in the Global Top 300 in the WURI.

CNU also placed 28th in the Entrepreneurial Spirit (A4) Top 100 category; 27th in the Social Responsibility (A6) Top 100 category; and 61st place for the Culture/Values (B5) Top 100 category.







FACULTY PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT



EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

In 2024, Cebu Normal University continued to champion Education for Sustainable Development by actively promoting transformative education that fosters global citizenship, social equity, and environmental stewardship.








RESEARCH INSTITUTES

The research institutes (RIs) of the university play a critical role in the advancement of knowledge, innovation, and evidence-based decision making.

The RIs are the Research Institute for Ageing and Health, the Research Institute for Computational Mathematics and Physics, the Research Institute for Tropical Biology and Pharmacological Biotechnology, and the Institute for Research in Innovative Instructional Delivery.

As centers of intellectual inquiry, the RIs published 30 papers in reputable journals, completed 16 papers, and facilitated 32 ongoing papers.

Beyond their core mandate of conducting scientific and technical investigations, these institutions also contributed significantly to human capital development through the conduct of 14 specialized training programs.

By organizing workshops, seminars, and capacity-building activities, research institutes ensure the dissemination of research findings, the transfer of technology, and the development of skills among professionals, students, policymakers, and industry stakeholders.



EXTENSION PROJECTS


In today's rapidly evolving education landscape, the role of universities extends far beyond traditional academic pursuits such as the generation of knowledge and innovation of current ideas that fuel technological advancements. As an institution committed to societal advancement, CNU has been engaging proactively with communities to help address their evolving needs. The institution aspires to promote the implementation of extension services that are need-based and impact-oriented – those projects that catalyze transformative change in every community and stakeholders that CNU serves.

The administration committed 2,000-3,000 beneficiaries annually for extension programs, servicing underserved beneficiaries. In 2024, CNU went beyond the target with 19, 707 beneficiaries who were composed of single parents, out-of-school youth, senior citizens, Alternative Learning System (ALS) students, lactating mothers, low-income earners, and other underprivileged individuals. The beneficiary turnout was 656.9% or 16,707 higher than the 3,000 target.

This milestone cannot be achieved without our 45 esteemed partners from the local government units and industries supporting CNU's 44 extension programs, which include 28 continuing education and 16 short-term trainings, that are need-based and impact- oriented.

In line with our commitment to inclusivity and relevance, the administration has created a new extension services framework, embodied in the acronym RE-EMPOWERMENT. This innovative agenda seamlessly integrates research (R) and extension (E) services, setting forth strategic directions that align with the dynamic needs of communities. RE-EMPOWERMENT delineates a comprehensive approach to extension services, focusing on key thematic areas that resonate in the university's academic offerings and external campus development programs. These thrusts encompass Entrepreneurship, Mental health and well-being, Partnership, Opportunities, Women's rights, Energy generation, Resource conservation, Material recovery, E-transaction, Natural hazard mitigation, and Technology-proofing.



CADEMIC PROGRAMS

To strengthen the delivery of quality education and ensure its responsiveness to evolving trends, Cebu Normal University (CNU) remains committed to equipping its faculty with relevant training aligned with its four core functions: research, curriculum development, instruction, and extension.


Through the collaborative efforts of various organizations within and beyond the university, students are also engaged in initiatives that broaden their academic experiences and cultural perspectives.

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION

Excellence has become a habit as evident in the number of accredited programs of Cebu Normal University. In 2024, CNU's 35 programs were accredited/re-accredited by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines, a 9.38% increase from 32 accredited programs in 2023. The 35 programs include seven (7) with Level II, 12 with Level III, and 16 with Level IV. The university has six programs vying for accreditation.




STUDENT DEVELOPMENT AND PERFORMANCE


I. GRADUATES

Cebu Normal University produced a total of 1,777 graduates (1,668 for undergraduate studies and 109 for graduate studies) across Main, Balamban, and Medellin campuses. Of the graduates, 1,500 (84.41%) came from the Main Campus, while 107 (6.02%) and 170 (9.57%) were produced by Balamban Campus and Medellin Campus, respectively.

The number of graduates produced by CNU served as a significant metric, reflecting the performance and capacity of its educational system.



ECHNOLOGY-INCLUSIVE INSTITUTION

In pursuit of transforming Cebu Normal University into GREAT SMART campuses, the university implemented two big-ticket projects worth P1.946.696.250.

The amount is broken down into P998,864,500 for the Information and Communications Technology Modernization Development program, P947,831,750 for the Centralized Student Smart hub project, which will house various technologyinfused facilities that will help the university deliver quality education and create a digital environment to boost learning efficiency.

Of the amount, P30 million was allotted for the first-ever university-run broadcasting radio station.

The projects are both crucial for enhancing the university's academic and administrative digital promoting operations, learning, improving overall efficiency and accessibility.

The projects were formalized through the signing of the Memorandum of Agreement between CNU and Lancaster Technology and Development Corporation, a Taguig-based firm, in September 2024.
