WHEREAS, there is a need for all sectors of Philippines society to relentlessly pursue its development strategy to reach the SDGs and its targets;

WHEREAS, the Cebu Normal University has embarked an integrated extension service program aimed at foregoing partnerships between its scholars-cum- practitioners and organized groups in rural areas to collectively address issues on education, health, environment, livelihood and peace that are essentials to the achievement of the SDGs and PDP 2028;

WHEREAS, the Cebu Normal University has embarked on an extension project titled "MML to MLL 1.0 Mathematics Mini-Lessons to Mitigate Learning Loss: Corrective Instruction for the Students of San Roque National High School".

ARTICLE I THE PROJECT





These objectives and the significance of the training collectively support the university's efforts to maintain and enhance the quality of its academic programs.






